International agencies from Oxfam to UNICEF have come out in 2019 with calls for specific, dedicated government investment in kids.

Scott McCain, President of JSM Capital says, "The research is indisputable and the game changer is early childhood experiences and access to quality early childhood education. What is vital to Canadian businesses and the economy is how we invest in the future."

Karen Gray, Interim General Manager, Toronto Children's Services says, "As the service system manager for Canada's largest city, we know how important early childhood is and the difference access to quality programs and services for kids can make, particularly for children whose families experience economic and social inequity."

Mark MacDonald, Lead Partner, Government & Public Sector (Ontario), EY Canada says, "As it is critical to the success of our future workforce, Canada needs to be looking at how we approach the early years. The double dividend of supporting children while getting their parents back into the workforce cannot be denied."

Paediatrician Dr Malini Dave says, "Early education opportunities are crucial to brain development and overall health outcomes for children. Play-based learning

has a profound impact in the early years when children are developing language, social, literacy, numeracy and problem solving skills, as well as self-regulation and confidence. These crucial skills impact health and well-being throughout the lifespan."
