As a champion of early childhood education, you will already know that the Government of Canada announced a historic \$30 billion investment in April to build a high-quality, affordable and accessible early learning and child care (ELCC) system nationwide.

This was a monumental announcement for Canada and an important step forward for families, but the work does not stop here. The federal government is in the process of negotiating five-year agreements with each of Canada's territories and provinces to determine how and when this funding will be allocated.

British Columbia, Manitoba, the Yukon, Quebec, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland and Labrador have reached agreements with the federal government. There are also a lot of incredible people and organizations working in every single corner of our country to make this dream a reality.

We can recognize the very important work that is now underway.
